

**DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS
FOR
SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT**

1. **Authorizationⁱ**

2. **Minimum Need:**

The Office of the People's ("OPC") Counsel proposes to procure the services of Lexis/Nexis, a division of RELX, Inc. to provide a computer based legal research subscription service for fiscal year 2022.

3. **Estimated Fair and Reasonable Price:**

\$ 28,836

4. **Facts That Justify a Sole Source Procurement:**

- A. OPC is an independent agency of the District of Columbia government. By law, it is the advocate for consumers of natural gas, electric and telephone services in the District. District of Columbia law designates the Office as a party to all utility-related proceedings before the Public Service Commission. The Office also represents the interests of District ratepayers before federal regulatory agencies. The Office is authorized to investigate the operation and valuation of utility companies independently of any pending proceedings.
- B. Lexis/Nexis is a leading global provider of legal, regulatory and business information and analytic that help customers increase productivity, improve decision making and outcomes, and advance the rule of law.
- C. OPC's Legal Services Division utilizes Lexis/Nexis for its legal research needs and desires to maintain continuity in the process.
- D. It is for the reasons outlined herein that it is recommended that a sole source contract be awarded to Lexis/Nexis.

DC Law: 34-804, hereby established within the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia, has established by DC Law: 34-801, an office to be known as the “Office of the People’s Counsel”. The office shall be a party, as of right, in any investigation, valuation, revaluation, or proceeding of any by nature by the Public Service Commission of or concerning a public utility operating in the District of Columbia.
