ORDER

FORMAL CASE NO. 1180, IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF WASHINGTON GAS LIGHT COMPANY FOR THE AUTHORITY TO INCREASE EXISTING RATES AND CHARGES FOR GAS SERVICE, Order No. 22463

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1. By this Order, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("Commission") addresses witness unavailability filings from the Parties in this proceeding and reschedules the evidentiary hearing to August 14, 2025.¹ The revised procedural schedule is included as Attachment A.

II. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

2. On August 5, 2024, Washington Gas Light Company ("WGL") filed an Application requesting authority to increase existing rates and charges for gas service in the District of Columbia ("District").² The requested rates are designed to collect approximately \$257.2 million in total revenue, representing a \$45.6 million increase in weather-normalized annual revenue. This includes the transfer of \$11.7 million in costs associated with natural gas system upgrades previously approved by the Commission (PROJECT*pipes*). The net increase in new revenues is \$33.9 million, reflecting an approximate 11.9% increase over current rates.

3. In Order No. 22446, the Commission determined that an evidentiary hearing should be convened to resolve material issues of fact in dispute for nine issues. In that Order, the Commission scheduled the evidentiary hearing for August 5, 2025.³ On June 26, 2025, WGL filed a Notice to inform us that a certain witness would be unavailable on that date. The Apartment and Office Building Association of Metropolitan Washington ("AOBA") filed a Response to this Notice, and the Office of the People's Counsel for the District of Columbia ("OPC") filed a motion to reschedule the evidentiary hearing on July 1, 2025.

III. DISCUSSION

4. In its Notice, WGL represents that one of its witnesses, Patrick Baryenbruch, is unavailable on August 5, 2025, due to overseas travel. He is available starting August 11, 2025. If Witness Baryenbruch is not needed for cross-examination, then WGL requests that the Commission excuse him.⁴

5. In its Response, AOBA indicates that it may have questions for Witness Baryenbruch. AOBA is willing to meet with the parties to discuss alternative dates for Witness Baryenbruch to appear at a hearing.⁵

6. In its Motion, OPC represents that two of its witnesses, Bion Ostrander and Brian Andrews, are unavailable on August 5, 2025. OPC represents that they are available on August 14, 2025, and request that the Commission reschedule the evidentiary hearing to that date or a later date.⁶ OPC represents that the testimony of Witnesses Ostrander and Andrews is relevant to the material issues of fact in dispute identified in Order No. 22446. OPC indicates that AOBA and the District of Columbia Government do not oppose OPC's request.⁷

IV. <u>DECISION</u>

7. The Commission finds that all three witnesses who are unavailable on August 5, 2025, WGL Witness Baryenbruch, OPC Witness Ostrander, and OPC Witness Andrews, are essential to the evidentiary hearing since their testimony is relevant to the material issues of fact in dispute identified in Order No. 22446. Thus, a new date for the evidentiary hearing is needed. The Commission scheduled a meeting on July 9, 2025, with the parties to discuss alternative dates to hold the hearing.⁸ The parties agreed that August 14, 2025, is acceptable to the witnesses identified as necessary for the evidentiary hearing. Thus, the Commission reschedules the evidentiary hearing to August 14, 2025. The Commission will begin the hearing at 9:00 a.m. in the Commission hearing room.

8. Due to the change in the date for the evidentiary hearing, the Commission revises the procedural schedule included in Order No. 22446. Motions to correct the transcript will now be due August 27, 2025, while post-hearing briefs will be due September 4, 2024. The revised procedural schedule is included as Attachment A.

9. The Office of the People's Counsel for the District of Columbia's Motion to Reschedule Evidentiary Hearing Due to Witnesses Unavailability is **GRANTED**;

10. The evidentiary hearing in this proceeding is **RESCHEDULED** to August 14, 2025, beginning at 9:00 a.m.;

11. Parties shall file motions to correct the transcript from the evidentiary hearing by August 27, 2025;

12. Post-hearing briefs shall be filed by September 4, 2025; and

13. The procedural schedule is **AMENDED** as provided in Attachment A.
